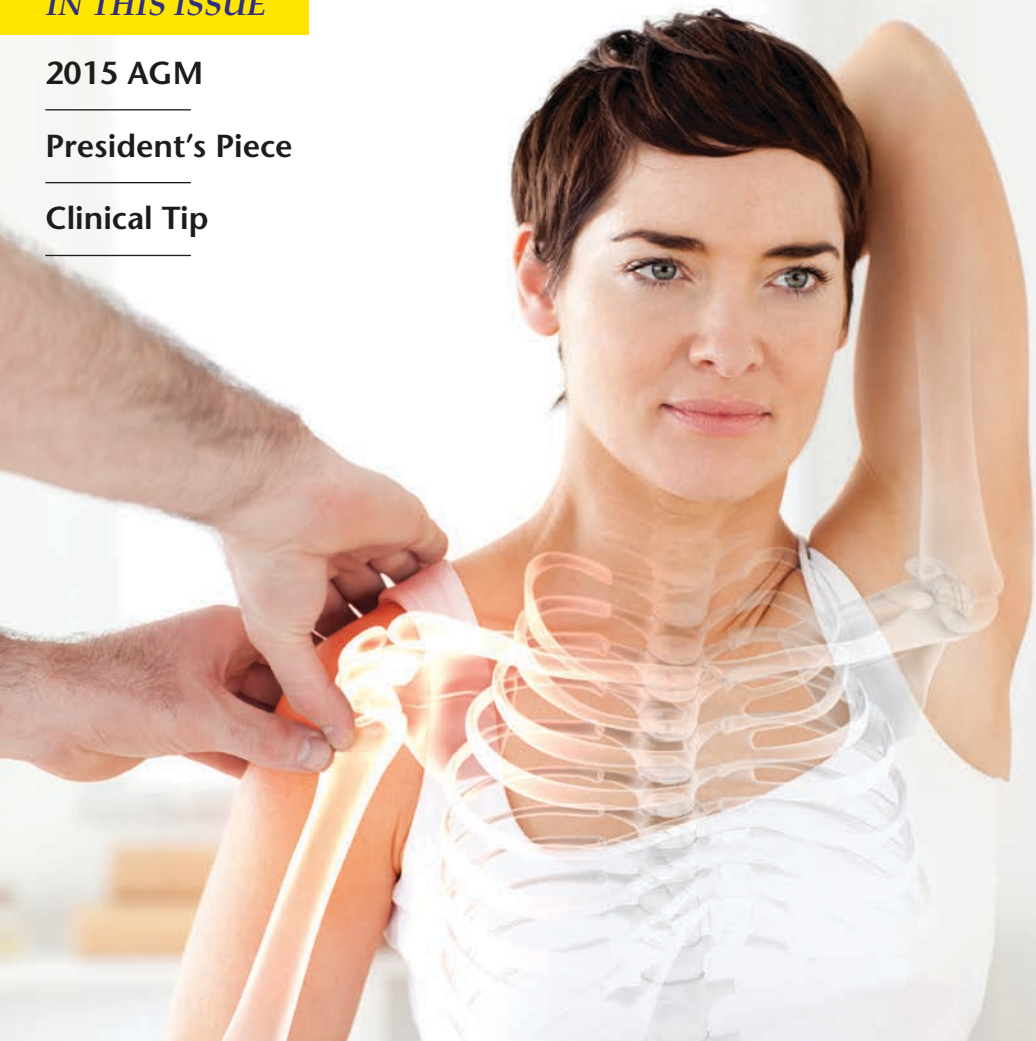

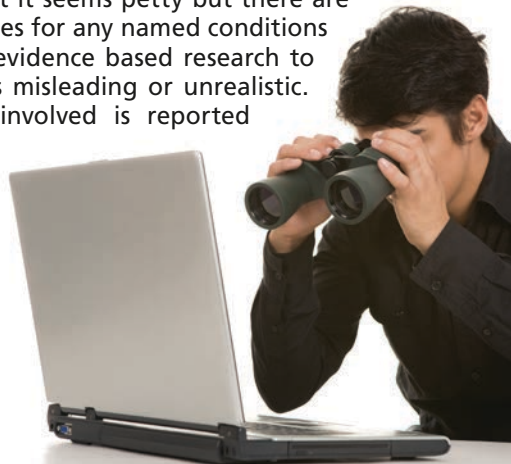

If these are found then the practitioner involved is reported to the Advertising Standards Authority and the respective Professional Organisations. These 'watchdog' groups are still very active and are at present resulting in many practitioners being reported per day.

Complementary and Natural Healthcare Council (CNHC)

Following meetings within the General Medical Council in April news that impacts on registered members and potential referrals:

CNHC is the UK voluntary regulator for complementary healthcare practitioners that was set up with government support to protect the public by providing a UK voluntary register of complementary therapists. CNHC's register has been approved as an Accredited Register by the Professional Standards Authority for Health and Social Care. This means CNHC has met the Professional Standards Authority's demanding standards. All CNHC registered practitioners are entitled to use CNHC's quality mark which demonstrates a commitment to professionalism and high standards. The public and those who commission the services of complementary healthcare practitioners can choose with confidence, by looking for the CNHC quality mark.

General Medical Council (GMC) guidance confirms that doctors are able to refer patients to practitioners on Accredited Registers.

LCSP CLINICAL TIP

Who provides approval when a child requires treatment? Because he or she cannot consent for him or herself, normally someone with parental responsibility or appropriate authority should consent on behalf of the child.

The Children Act (1989) lists responsible people.

They are:

- The child's parents if they were married at the time of conception or birth
- The child's mother (not the father, even if they were subsequently married unless parental responsibility was acquired by becoming registered as the child's father)
- A court order
- Parental responsibility agreement
- A legally appointed guardian
- A person where the court has made a residence order
- A local authority named in a care order for a child
- A local authority or authorised person with an emergency protection order



If, as a clinician, you find yourself unsure whether someone accompanying a child is in a position to give consent for treatment, it is up to the individual to prove to your satisfaction that they have the authority to do so. Ask the individual to produce documentary evidence to satisfy your enquiry. It may save difficult questions later on.

Caradoc Shop: now open!

Massage and soft tissue therapy practitioners can now access a one-stop online shop selling core products at discounted rates.

It is aimed at sole practitioners and small businesses and members that cannot find what they are looking for in the shop can contact one of over 80 Caradoc suppliers for further assistance.

Peter Masters, of Caradoc Medical Services, said: "For practitioners who are self-employed or who own a very small practice, essential supplies and equipment for the treatment room can be very costly."

"As Caradoc is a consortium we are able to use a collective buying power to bring down costs on key items required by LCSP members. And because we have many practitioners as members we decided to create a specific online shop via our website so that it is easily accessible."

The online shop is a pilot scheme by Caradoc Medical Services and feedback from members is encouraged to ensure that changes can be made to ensure the service is as useful as it can be to members.
