Medico-legal advice

Two people have said to me recently words to the effect that they don't care what the law says about consent in children under 16; they don't want to treat them without their mother or another relative present.

I completely understand the anxiety. However to be clear the judgement in 1987 in the Gillick case allowed a child under sixteen to consent to treatment subject to certain requirements. This judgement was rolled out across the whole of healthcare. Therefore if you have a (say) 14 or 15vear old who wants treatment, understands the benefits, disadvantages, consequences of no treatment and alternatives available, does not want to discuss with a parent and will benefit from treatment, then that child can consent. The presence of a chaperone (mother) is a separate issue. Yes the child can consent but you as a clinician can ask for the child to be accompanied by his or her mother or another adult if you feel more comfortable. A chaperone is present for one of two reasons; for the reassurance of the patient or the safety of the clinician. Although the child can consent you can say you are not happy to treat without a chaperone (mother) and you can ask the child to return accompanied. I hope that clarifies the issue.


